- Interest in the course (most important) most of the statement could deal with this, in some cases
- Motivated student
- No spelling or grammatical mistakes
- Clearly written
- Balance studies with 'life'
- Interesting person
- Work experience (if relevant)
- Wider key skills (e.g. teamwork, if relevant)
- Numeracy or Communication (if the applicant is yet to pass GCSE Maths or English)
- Future career if relevant and known
- Any interesting hobbies (especially if relevant)

ADMISSIONS TUTORS WERE ASKED 'WHAT SHOULD APPLICANTS AVOID?

- Waffle
- Swallowing a dictionary
- Statements with no examples or evidence
- Very ordinary interests e.g. going down the pub
- Lying
- Becoming somebody you are not
- Rushing producing a poorly written statement
- Reducing <u>all</u> experiences to skills stacking shelves in a supermarket provides an honest income – don't sell it for anything else
