£45 in free books for the school!



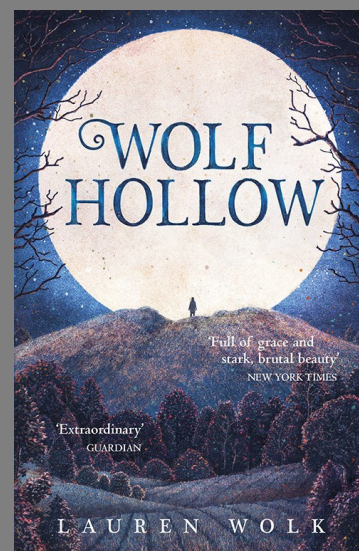
CILIP Carnegie Medal Shadowing Presentation in Hackney Schools

Student Librarian Reward Trip to Foyles & Central Saint Martins College of Art

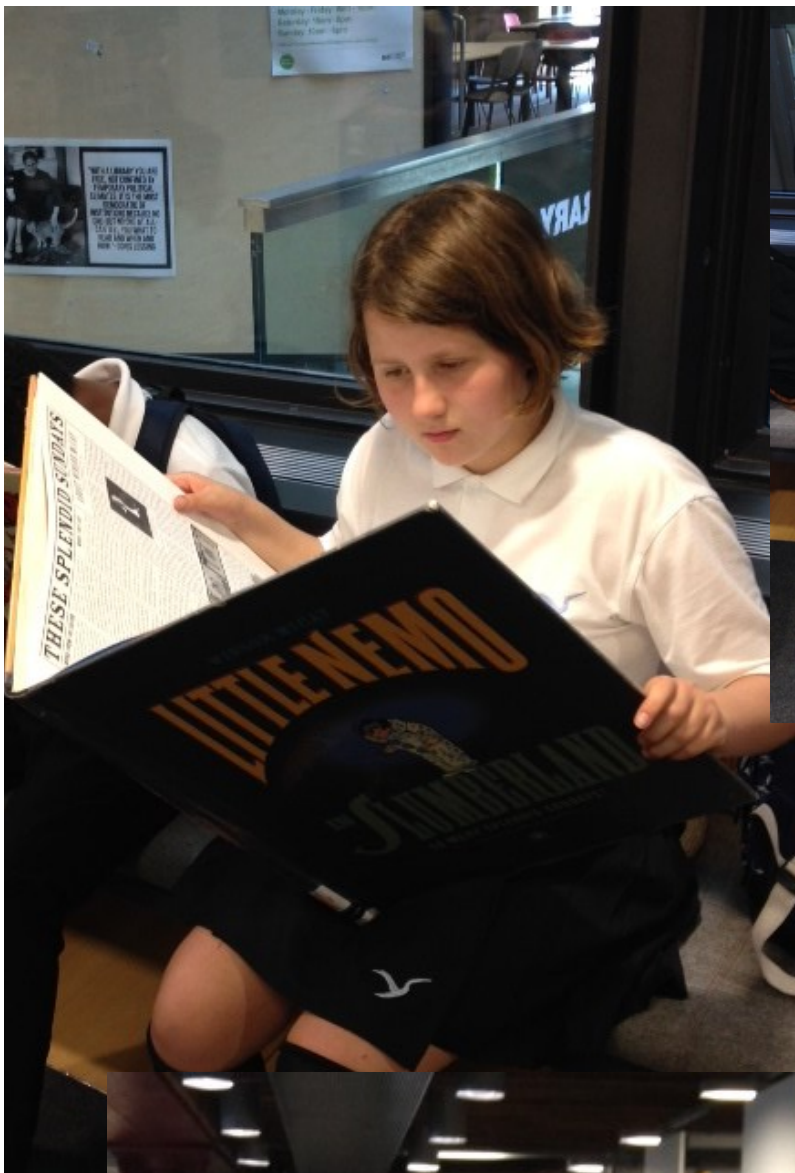
