

## Calculating your average GCSE score.

In September 2019, the students who are starting their Key Stage 5 studies will be receiving numeric 9-1 grades in the majority, but not all, GCSE subjects. This cohort will therefore have a mixture of reformed and unreformed grades, with most results being under the reformed 9-1 structure.

GCSE Score Calculation for 2019 starters

The grades 9-1 have been allocated the following Points for 2019 September starters

For the reformed subjects the points will be:

Numeric GCSE Grade	9	8	7	6	5	4	3	2	1	U
Points	8	7.67	7	6.33	5.67	5	4	3	1	0

For the remaining subjects the points remain the same:

Legacy GCSE Grade	A*	A	B	C	D	E	F	G	U
Points	8	7	6	5	4	3	2	1	0

To calculate the Average GCSE Score, add up the points for each grade and divide by the number of subjects.

Pathway	Courses	Entry requirements
Applied	BTEC Sport plus EPQ or Core Maths	4 GCSEs or BTECS grades 9-4 inc English (4) and a Science
Core 1	3 A levels plus Extended Project or Core Maths	GCSE Av. Point score of 5 or above 5 GCSEs grades 9-4 inc English (4) and Maths (4)
Core 2	4 A levels All 4 subjects need to be completed in Year 13	GCSE Av. of at least 6.5 5 GCSEs grades 9-4 inc English (5) and Maths (5)
Supported	3 A levels and GCSE resit (in either English or Maths)	GCSE Av. of 5 or above 5 GCSEs grades 9-4 English or Maths below grade 4

There are also entry requirements for each individual course that must be met in order to be eligible to do the course. These are all published in the course directory.
