

Half term	Unit Title	Description
10.1	Conflict and Tension, 1894-1918	Wider World Depth Study - Causes of WW1 Students to learn source comprehension and evaluation, structuring an historical narrative, supporting and challenging an argument and making sophisticated judgements based on a range of evidence. Topic will with focus on how WW1 was caused, including the Alliance System, Militarism, Imperialism and Nationalism in Europe at the time.
10.2	Conflict and Tension, 1894-1918	Wider World Depth Study - Stalemate Focus on stalemate, covering topics including Trench warfare, tactics, technology, and specific battles such as the Somme and Gallipoli.
10.3	Conflict and Tension, 1894-1918	Wider World Depth Study - Ending WW1 Focus on how WW1 came to an end, covering topics including the exit of Russia and entry of USA to the war effort.
10.4	America 1920-1973: Opportunity and inequality	Non-British Depth Study – Boom Students to learn how to comprehend and evaluate interpretations, describe key events, identify and explain impact of events and make sophisticated judgements based on a range of evidence. This unit begins with the Boom, covering topics including ‘the roaring twenties’, Al Capone and immigration to USA at this time.
10.5	America 1920-1973: Opportunity and inequality	Non British Depth Study – Bust Focus on USA in 1930s, covering topics including The Great Depression and the New Deal.
10.6	America 1920-1973: Opportunity and inequality	Non British Depth Study – Post WW2 Focus on USA post WW2, covering topics including McCarthyism, Civil Rights movement and Women’s liberation movement.
