Term	Unit	Description
9.1	Life In Modern Britain Britain and multiculturalism and key concepts	Students are introduced to key concepts and terms. The unit explores what identity means and how we categorise this? Students explore the historically events which has had an impact on how diverse the UK is through immigration. Students explore key legislation and events
9.2	Life In Modern Britain Media and International organisations	Students are introduced to a range of media sources and how our media is regulated through democracy and key case studies. The impact of media both positively and negatively is explored. Students are introduced to key international organisations understanding their role and impact on a larger scale.
9.3	Rights and Responsibility Criminal Justice System	Students are introduced to the criminal justice system; the age of criminal responsibility and how key legislation supports the judicial process. Students will explore the key case of Tottenham riots.
9.4	<u>Rights and Responsibility</u> Understanding Rights	Students start to consider relationship between rights and responsibilities. Students are introduced to Magna Carta and key legislations that has been crucial to the development of rights citizens have. Topical issues explored around national security v privacy.
9.5	Active Citizenship	Students are introduced to concepts of a good citizen v an active citizen. Students learning the ways to affect change, how trade unions and government work can lead to effective change. Students explore the steps citizens can take when wanting to support a cause. These skills and learning lead into the next unit.
9.6	Politics and Participation Taking Citizenship Action	Students consider a social issue in developing awareness and hope to affect change through their actions. This unit is part of their final GCSE exam in Paper 1.
