Also thanks to all staff that helped out during show week and came along to support our fabulous pupils.





























SNS welcomed a very special guest last week as part of the BBC's centenary celebrations visiting just 10 schools across the country. Ugo Monye, the former English rugby union player, Strictly Come Dancing competitor and Question of Sport team leader.


Ugo Monye spoke of being brought up on a north London council estate by a single parent mother who worked three jobs to sustain him and his siblings. The sadness caused when his father left the family home. Of disappointments when he wasn't chosen for teams, the racism and discrimination he faced. Of being one of just three Black students at the boarding school his mother sent him to, of the painful surgeries he endured because of rugby injuries. His championing of women in sport. And of his ambition, resilience, hard work and self-belief, which kept him going. SNS core values, which resonated with many of our students.

The Q&A which followed was great fun with Ugo Monye launching a rugby shaped microphone across the theatre.
