Aims

Our school has the highest aspirations for all our students and we make every effort to ensure that our students who are not financially advantaged or have not achieved KS2 standards in English and Maths receive excellent support during their first year of secondary school.

We use our Pupil Premium Grant (£935 per pupil) and Literacy and Numeracy Catch-Up Premium (£20,000) to provide the following support to our year 7 pupils.

Provision for year 7 in 2014-15

Students eligible for PP funding or who enter our year 7 cohort below KS2 standards during 2014-15 will have benefited from one or more of the following:

- Smaller class sizes in English, Maths, Science at KS3
- Involvement in intervention groups for English and Maths
- Subsidised places on school visits which go beyond core provision
- Saturday School
- Behaviour Intervention sessions for KS3 students

Measuring the impact of PPG funding for year 7 in 2014-15

The impact of our interventions is evident in the achievement data for year 7, collected at the end of the academic year:

- English:
 - 98% of students achieved a L4+ (83% achieved L5+)
 - 60% of PPI students made 2+ sublevels of progress in year 7
- Maths:
 95% of students achieved a L4+ (82% achieved L5+)
 65% of PPI students made 2+ sublevels of progress in year 7
- Across subjects: 87.5% of students achieved 5 level 5s (75% including English and Maths)

Literacy development programme for Yr 7 and 8 (extra curricular literacy lessons for small groups of students not yet confidentally level 4 in English).

(Funding staff salaries and training)

Part resourcing of Turkish/Kurdish home school liaison workers

Saturday school (provision for Yr 7 and 8 PP students who require additional Maths and English support)

Homework club

(Homework club supervisor salary and sixth form support workers' pay)

Inclusion team staffing working with FSM students to support engagement.
