



#### Paper 1:


- Reading and writing fiction texts

## KS4 H/W – Two half-termly writing tasks




- Science home learning will focus on preparing for the mocks.

- Write using paragraphs



#### FOR USING THE STAR METHOD

- 1. Understand the question
- 2. Be specific and quantitative
- 3. Focus on your own contributions
- 4. Prepare in advance
- 5. Use relevant examples and experiences
- 6. Be concise
- 7. Highlight your achievements
- 8. Be honest
- 9. Keep it positive
- 10. Be relatable



#### What happens if students don't get the grades?

- If your child does not secure their place on results day, Sixth Forms and Colleges have walk-in enrolment days where students can enrol
- Students can retake their Maths and/or English Language GCSE whilst studying T Levels, A Levels or BTECs – dependant on the education provider
- BSix College, Westminster Kingsway and New City College allow students to retake their Maths and English GCSE




## To finish...
