Fundraising needs:

Current funding needs identified by SNS are:

PE equipment:

Funding sports day is becoming increasingly difficult as spend a significant amount of the PE budget on hiring Finsbury Park track. We are in desperate need to renew much of our sports equipment which we cannot afford such as rackets and table tennis tables.

A stage set:

We would like to buy a modular stage set – for Drama and Music lessons, school shows, open evenings, assemblies and celebrations (benefits for the whole school). Starting with a basic set (which can be added to) £2,370 (inc VAT).

The School Musical (and other performance events):

The school musical is an annual event in which over 150 students from every year group contribute to the final performance. Whether actors, musicians, designers or technicians. This is a HUGE undertaking for all involved and it costs A LOT of money to put on (acquiring the rights alone for 'We Will Rock You' cost around £1,500). If we could have a pot for donations to support the musical and other school performances, this would be amazing and allow us to continue to put on our famous productions. We are also open to sponsorships – if parents work for local business – we would love to include promotions or advertising in the programme, interval etc in return for sponsors.

Drama trips:

As part of GCSE Drama we are obliged to take students to see Live Theatre as a requirement of their written exam. The average price of a single theatre ticket in London is £30.55, even with school discount (which not all venues offer) we are looking at £15-£20 per student. With 49 students in Year 11 alone that equates to £980 for one theatre trip (49x£20). This is just under a third of our entire annual budget (Annual Drama budget is £3500 – Drama is taught to every year aroup 7-13)

As it is a requirement of the exam, we cannot oblige parents to pay for this cost. If we could have a 'pay it forward' style system whereby parents can contribute towards an additional ticket we could help take more students to theatre across all year groups.

School trips

The school organises various sorts of trips, some for all the kids in a year group, others for specific subjects. The costs vary, but the common theme is that we don't want any kids to miss out because of ability to pay – and we certainly don't want the teachers to have to foot the bill from their own pockets.

History

Year 13: Dublin trip - about £375-400 (3 days to support with Irish History module)

Year 11: Day trip to Belgium - about £120, with 80 places, with focus on helping PPI students attend as it makes a big difference to studies on WW1

Geography

Yr12 Swanage (Compulsory): £220

KS5 International Trip (optional): Approx £700 last time we ran it.

KS4 Walton on the Naze (compulsory): £18

They would like to run a KS4 residential. The cost of this would likely be around £170

Languages

Wordwall subscription (Fun engaging activities for language learning): £400 annual subscription. Theatre companies (French and Spanish plays in the school theatre): £300.

<u>Maths</u>

High Value: £500 - Puzzle Challenge Rewards Day - Happy Puzzle Company A rewards day for 100 pupils delivered in school by the Happy Puzzle Company

Mid Value: £75 - a graphic calculator to loan to a KS5 pupil

A graphic calculator greatly improves performance at A level Maths - to help pupils who cannot afford one we would like some to loan out for the duration of the course

Low Value: £16 - a pack of 10 entries to UKMT Maths Challenge (Junior/Intermediate/Senior)

High prior attaining pupils with a head and heart for Maths are selected each year from Y7-Y13

to take part in the UKMT Maths Challenge and this contribution covers 10 entries

iPads x 10 £300 each

Product Design:
